



Emperor Constantine: earth's king of kings kneels before Christ



Jerome: bringing the Living Word to every citizen of the empire

he Renaissance artist Caravaggio (1573-1610) evinced a remarkable fondness for Jerome, founder of monasteries and translator of the Bible into Latin, the common language of the Roman Empire, from the original Hebrew and Greek. Caravaggio's Jeromes are invariably shown naked, except for the seemingly incongruous red cloak, which bespeaks high rank in the church. Christians as commodities: Islam's 1400-year slave trade still survives



Poland's Sobieski and his angelic host save Vienna from the Muslims

f the Christian forces that relieved beleaguered in Vienna September 1683, the most fearsome were the famous Winged Hussars, led by King John Sobieski of Poland, and pictured in this modern-day digital image by Mariusz Kosik. The Turkish besiegers, already heavily engaged on one front by the forces of the Duke of Lorraine, watched in horror as Sobieski and his armored cavalry poured down from the heights overlooking the city. With their cry of "Jesus, Maria, ratuj!" ("Jesus, Mary, help!") and the eagle feathers streaming from the frames on their backs, the winged horsemen descended like avenging angels onto the Ottoman artillery.

Christian reformers rescue millions of children from the factories




